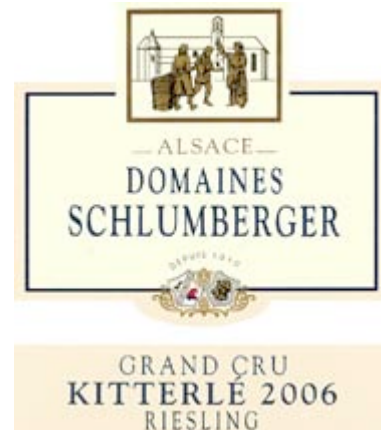

Alsace

Alsace is one of the most beautiful wine regions in the whole of France. Its vineyards, strung like jewels, surround villages where many wine dynasties have been making wine for centuries. This is the birthplace of some of the most charming, intense and delectable wines in the world.

Favoured by exceptional climatic and geological conditions, the vineyards of Riquewihr are among the most prestigious in all of Alsace. Here it is, on hillsides blessed by nature, that for the past 350 years, twelve generations of the Hugel family have followed the noble craft of winegrowing. Their name, indissociable from the history of Riquewihr and of Alsace, has become synonymous with quality.

The Hugel family tend their vines on the finest slopes of the locality, the Sporen and the Schoenenbourg, which have been renowned since the Middle Ages and where the grape varieties, which have created the worldwide reputation of Alsace wines, ripen under ideal conditions. With true Alsace character, these "Hugel" wines faithfully mirror the characteristics of each varietal and individual vintage.

Successive generations of the Cattin family have followed each other in the estate of Voegtlinshoffen, 10 km to the south of Colmar, capital of Alsace wine. Each one of them handed its know-how over to the next one and today, Joseph Cattin wine is highly typical and uses the most advanced techniques.

Domaines Schlumberger is one of Alsace's leading producers and has been run by successive generations of the Schlumberger family since 1810. They pride themselves on only producing wines from grapes grown in their own vineyards and of their 140 hectares 70 are classified as Grand Cru.

Bordeaux Red

Situated on the West coast of France around the Gironde estuary, Bordeaux remains the world's most influential wine producing region. Production is centered on the Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot grapes which are often blended with the lesser known Cabernet Franc, Malbec and Petit Verdot to produce wines of varying styles and prices. The minority of Chateaux's may grab the headlines with their mind boggling prices but Bordeaux's real charm lies in its lesser known regions and producers who remain rooted in reality.



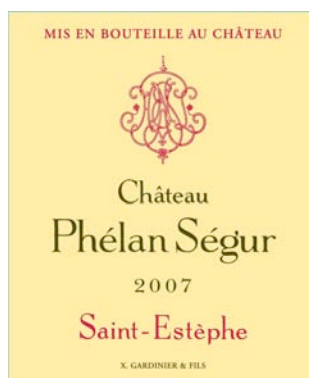
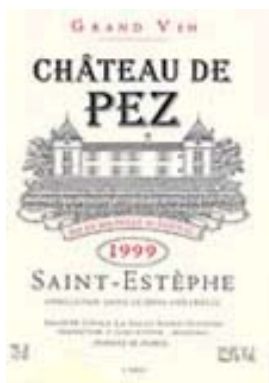

The wines in their youth have a delicately perfumed character which fills out and deepens in the years of maturity bringing added complexities of toffee and nutmeg that make Margaux so unique.

Graves

The history of wine production in Bordeaux has recorded that the first Bordeaux wines to be made and exported were from Graves. The region of Graves, which gets its name from the gravely soil, a vestige of the Ice Age glaciers, is totally different from the other wine regions of Bordeaux. Their personality traits are individual and unique – they all show a rich, earthy, almost tobacco scented character.

To produce this port, the grapes are lightly crushed and then fermented in a traditional stone lagar (with foot treading). Once the alcohol level has reached about 7%, aguardente (grape spirit) is added to stop fermentation. After about two years, the Port Shipper will decide whether it will be blended to form an ordinary young Ruby. "Vintage Character" denotes a superior ruby. It may be kept unblended and bottled after four to six years as a Late Bottled Vintage. Exceptionally good lots, from a fine year, will be bottled after two years and matured in the bottle to become Vintage Port - the finest and most expensive port.
